

TREE: A World in Itself at the Samuels Rehearsal Studio



TREE: A World in Itself is a multi-sensory, interactive universe enveloped in soft light, music, and silence. As evening falls, you'll rest under a rising moon, stars, and shimmering Milky Way, gathering strength to spread your wings like a fledgling bird of light.

This performance features five characters who continually adapt to the audience. In an intimate and welcoming atmosphere, the performance offers a ratio of one performing artist per young person to facilitate numerous personalized interactions.

This performance takes place at the Samuels Rehearsal Studio on the 7th Floor of the Samuel B. and David Rose Building. The address is 165 West 65th Street.

Getting to the Samuel Rehearsal Studio

BY SUBWAY: The Samuel Rehearsal Studio is a short distance from the **1** train at West 66th Street. It is a slightly longer distance from the **A, B, C, D** or **1** trains at 59th Street—Columbus Circle. Both subway stations are accessible via elevator.



Subway icons: white letters and numbers in colorful circles: 1 red, B orange, D orange, A blue, C blue.

BY BUS: The M5, M7, M10, M11, and M104 bus lines all stop within one block of the Samuel Rehearsal Studio.

Access-A-Ride: The recommended Access-A-Ride address for drop off closest to the main entrance is 165 West 65th Street (between Amsterdam Avenue and Broadway).

Parking:

Main Campus Parking (operated by ICON)

- Designated accessible parking spaces are located in the yellow section of the garage
- Entrance for Reserved Parking Section is on Amsterdam Avenue at 64th Street
- Parking permit and/or sticker must be displayed
- Advance reservations for parking include a \$5 service charge
- Height restrictions for vans apply

Venue Access:

The Samuel B. and David Rose Building is accessible from West 65th Street by elevator, stairs, and escalator.



This is the entrance to the elevator on the street level. It is located near the northeast corner of 65th Street and Amsterdam Avenue.



This is the Rose Building staircase that reads "Rose" on the steps. It is located in the middle of West 65th Street, facing towards Columbus Avenue.



This is the base of the street-level escalators, located next to the elevator.

The entrance to the Samuel B. and David Rose Building has manual, revolving, and automatic door options.



Audience Entrance and Security Gate:

The Box Office for Samuel Rehearsal Studio performances is located in the lobby of the Rose Building. Guests will be greeted by Lincoln Center staff and will be directed to enter through a security gate to reach the elevators.



To get to the Samuel Rehearsal Studio, guests can enter the Samuel B. and David Rose Building go past the security gate and use the elevators to get to the 7th floor.



Once the doors open on the 7th floor, guests will be in the lobby (pictured below). The entrance to the Samuel Rehearsal Studio is on your right.



About the Show



This is an interactive theater performance in Samuels Rehearsal Studio.

Guests can sit on a floor cushion or a chair.

There will be theatrical lighting on the stage, and some lighting in the audience area. Guests will be able to move around and enter/exit the space throughout the show.

Performers will offer objects to touch. Guests are welcomed to accept or decline.

Accommodations:

The venue is on an **accessible route**. Wheelchairs are available to borrow during the performance and on campus.



Assistive listening devices with headsets and neck loops available to borrow from lobby.



Chill out space available to the right and across the hall from the Samuels Rehearsal Studio. Guests are welcome to take a break during the performance and return when ready. Noise-reducing headphones, earplugs, fidgets, and other sensory items are available to borrow from lobby.



Access Concierge Service: Access Reps, trained to support guests with disabilities, are available to provide 1:1 support for individual guests and their party. Restrooms:

Men's and women's restrooms with one accessible stall each are located down the hall to the right across from the theater on the 7th Floor. Lincoln Center welcomes guests to use the restroom that most closely aligns with their gender identity or expression.





Food and Drink:

Light snacks are available for purchase on the 7th Floor lobby. Guests are welcome to bring outside food to eat in lobby.

There is a water fountain between the men and women's restrooms on the 7th floor. It is a bottle-friendly machine that has cups next to it for guests without a water bottle.



While You Wait

Visual Art stations are open from 11:00am to 6:00pm on the 10th floor of the Rose Building for drop in arts exploration.
